The Network (FCPN) is a county-wide resource—a forum and support system to empower and connect organizations, professionals and individuals who are dedicated to preserving the historic character of our region. The Network is an informal group, made possible through the support of the Cultural Alliance of Fairfield County (CAFC).

By design, the Network is NOT a formal organization with a board, bylaws or staff. It benefits greatly from the steady, ongoing support of a professional, staffed 501(c)(3), while not shouldering the heavy burden of founding and running such an organization.

Through group meetings, held once or twice a year, and an ongoing email listserv, the Network enables members to meet, exchange ideas, seek and offer help, share information, discuss challenges and successes, and create opportunities for joint advocacy. Meetings to date have included presentations and discussions on Placemaking and Preservation, Demolition Delay Ordinances, and Preservation: An Alphabet Soup Guide to Essential Terms (published and available for \$5).

The primary objective of the Network's structure is to create a robust, valuable, resource for Fairfield County preservationists that is ongoing and cost-effective. The goal is to cover all or at least most of its costs through modest membership fees paid to the Alliance. We acknowledge the support of The Jeniam Foundation that assisted with the start-up of the network.

The Network will ultimately reflect the needs, interests and energies of its members. The Network's Steering committee welcomes your help, thoughts, suggestions and participation as it develops and takes shape.
