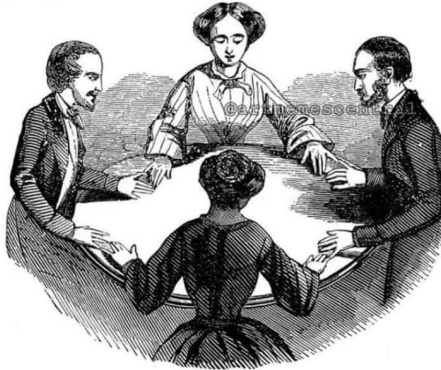
Land Acknowledgement

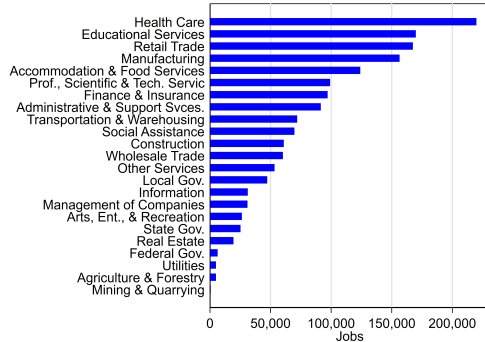

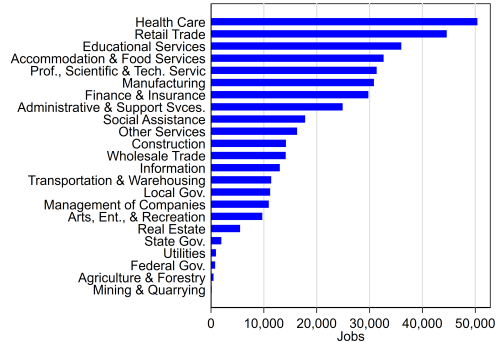

Connecticut



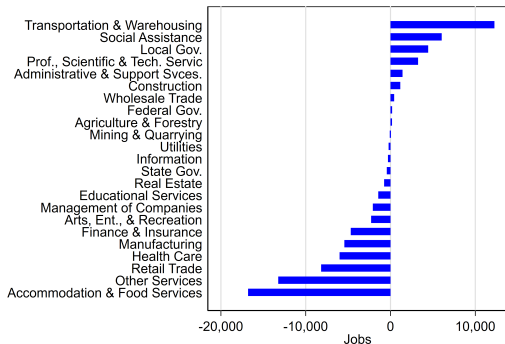

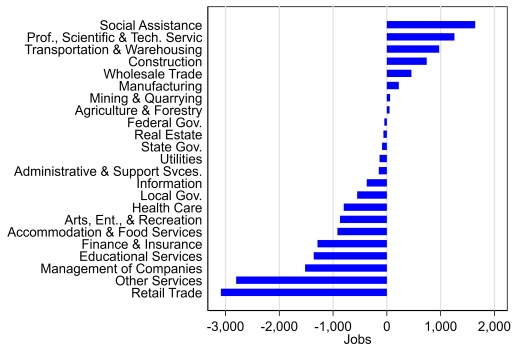
Change in Total Employment

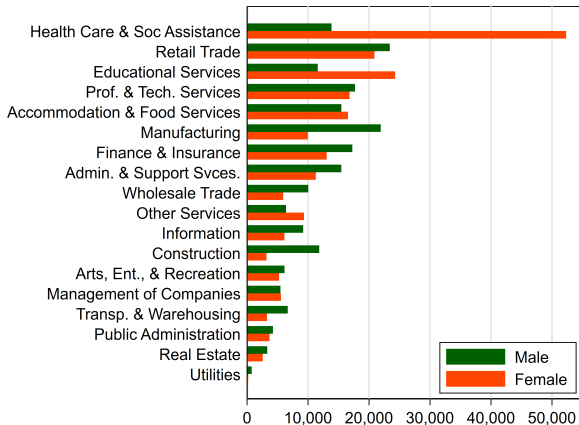

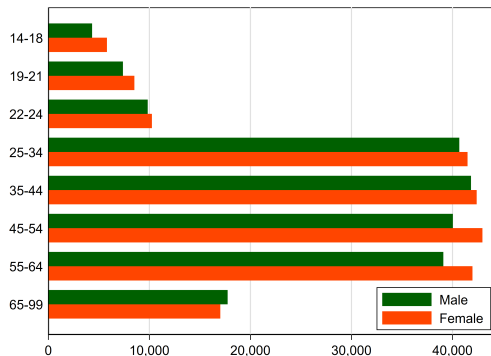
by Industry and Sex – 2022



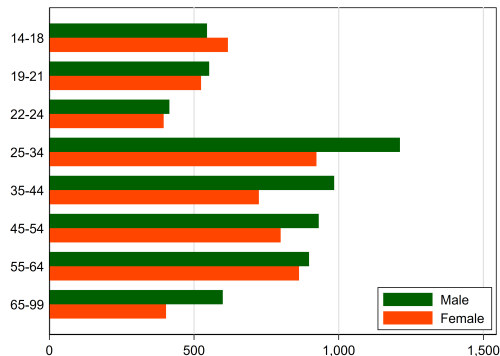
Fairfield County Employment

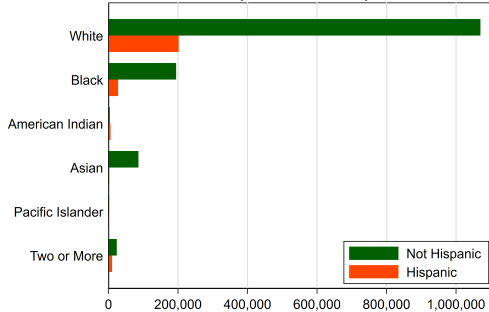

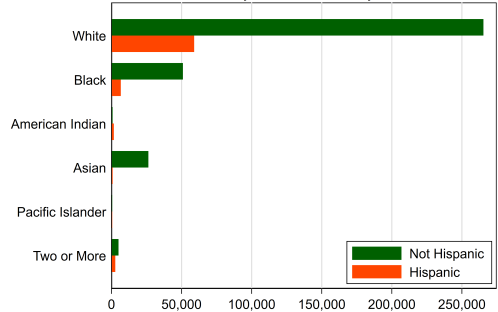

By Race and Ethnicity

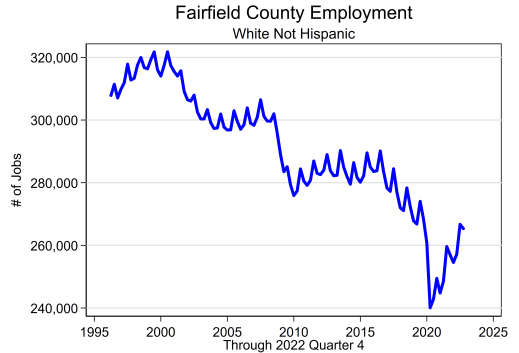
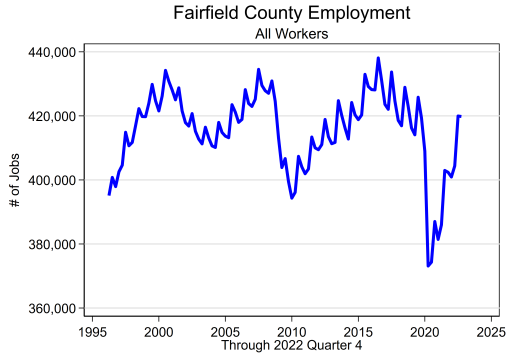

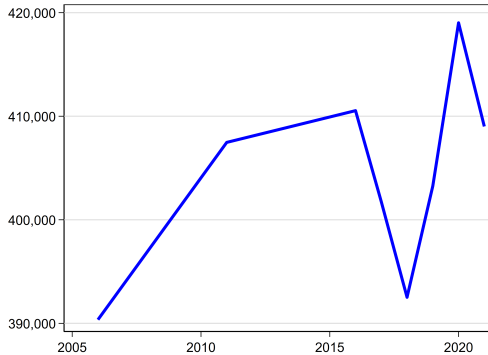

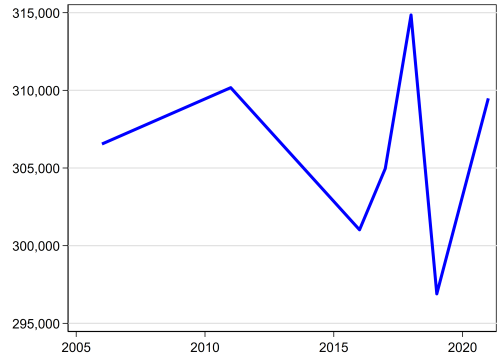


Fairfield County Population

Born in CT

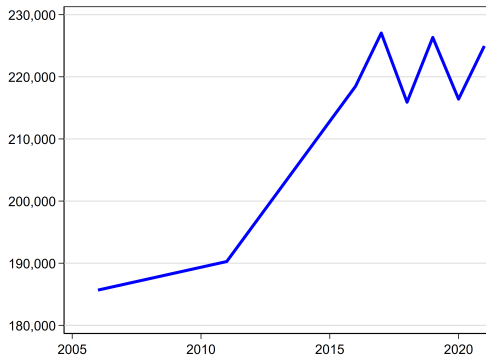


Born in USA outside CT



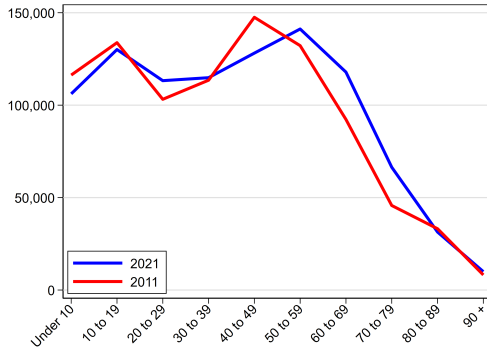

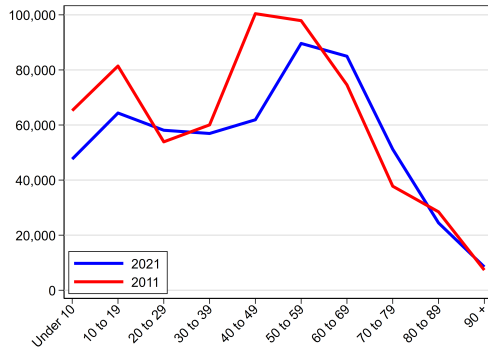
By Age Group



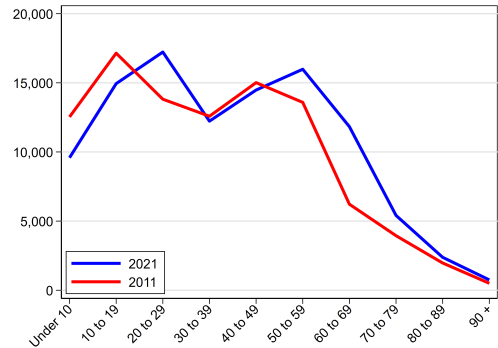
Fairfield County Population

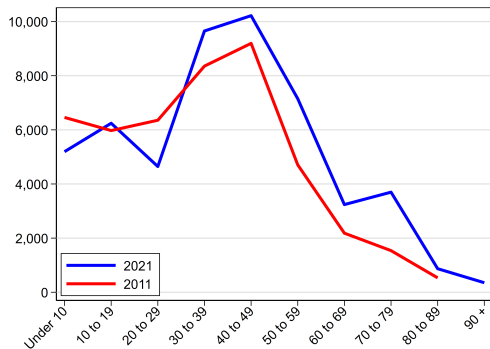

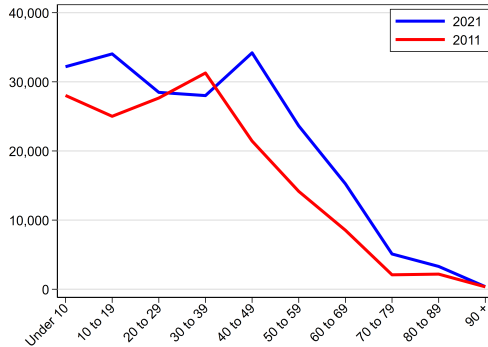

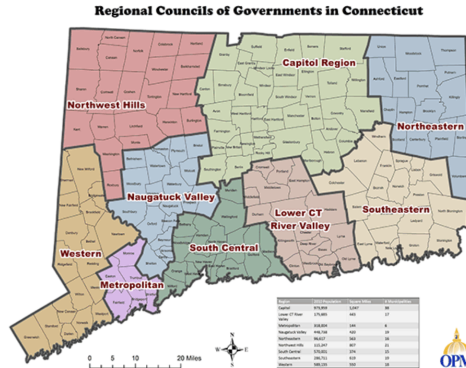
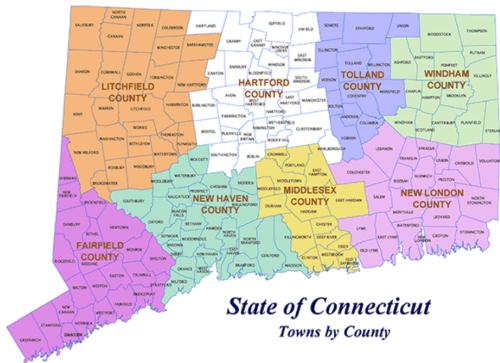
Fairfield County Population

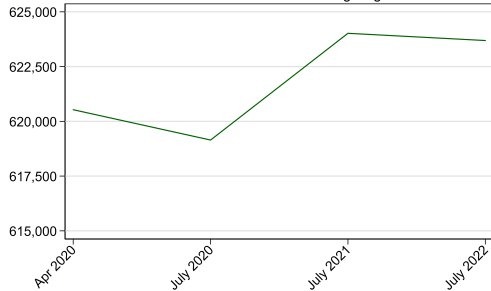

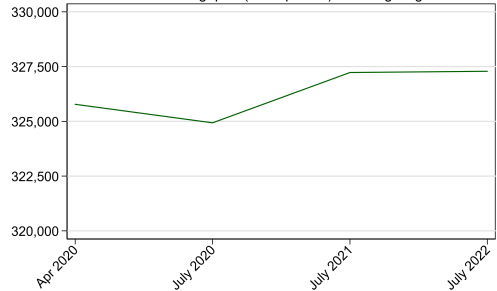

Western Connecticut Planning Region



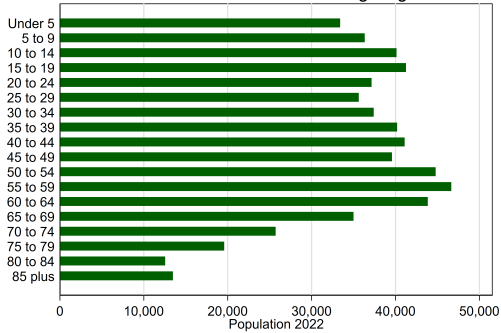

Greater Bridgeport (Metropolitan) Planning Region

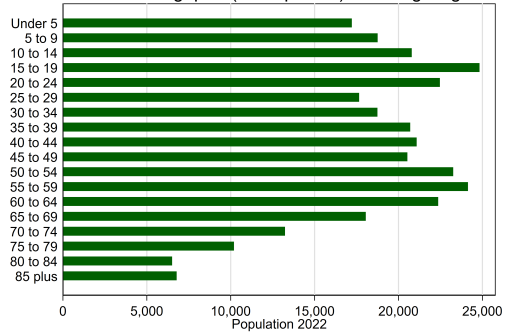

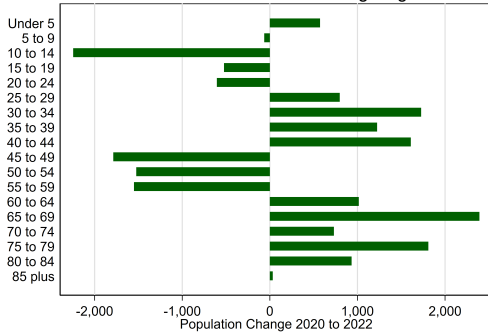

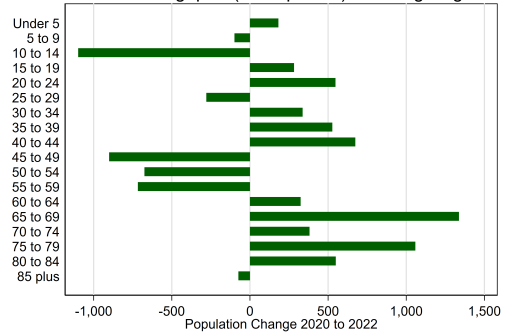
Greater Bridgeport (Metropolitan) Planning Region


