As a higher education and community educator with teaching experience in business writing and creative writing, Wesley is especially passionate about providing women & girls opportunities to engage in literary arts. She has facilitated community-based creative writing workshops for various organizations. Wesley is also the chairperson of BLaC (Building Leaders and Communities) Strategies, an emerging nonprofit focused on cross-community leadership development and community messaging.

A longtime Fairfield County resident, Wesley holds a B.A. from University of Connecticut, an M.F.A. from Manhattanville College, and is completing an Ed.D. in organizational leadership from Abilene Christian University. Former Editor of the Manhattanville Review and INKWELL literary journal, she was named the 2014 Manhattanville Writing Alumni Contest winner.
